



NOTIFICATION OF NET TANGIBLE ASSETS

The net tangible asset backing before providing for deferred tax for Whitefield Ltd as at 30 September 2015 was \$4.40 (prior month \$4.51)

Whitefield is a long term investor and does not intend to dispose of its total investment portfolio. Under current Accounting Standards, the company is required to provide for deferred capital gains tax liabilities or benefits, including those that may arise should the portfolio be disposed of in its entirety at the month end. After making this provision, the net asset backing of the company would be \$4.18 (prior month \$4.25).
